What To Do Immediately After A Collision

Checklist:

- Q Call the police to the scene of the collision. Even if there is no apparent damage, a police report will verify the collision. This will help if hidden damage is discovered later.
- q If injuries occurred, get medical attention immediately.
- Q Contact your insurance company as soon as possible after the collision. Note that some insurance policies require notice within 24 hours.
